# Who is a CASA?

A CASA is a volunteer Court Appointed Special Advocate (CASA) appointed by a judge for youth involved in Arizona's foster care system. CASA volunteers are there to change lives at the most challenging time in a child's life, and they do.

# What does a CASA do?

- Learn all you can about the child and their family and life.
- Visit with the child at least once a month.
- Make recommendations regarding the child's placement and services until permanency is achieved.
- Advocate for the child's best interests in court.

## Requirements

- Be 21 years of age and able to pass a background check.
- Dedicate approximately 10-12 hours per month, includes visiting with the child you are paired with.
- Complete 30-hours of pre-service training.
